

Second Baptist Church Ten (10) Guidelines for In-Person Worship

- 1. Follow all 2BC Rules of COVID Safety, or please stay home and worship with us online.
- 2. Upon entering the building, your temperature will be digitally scanned to ensure that it is less than 100.4. degrees F. If you are running a temperature, experiencing illness such as a cold, coughing, sneezing, shortness of breath, sore throat, feeling sick in anyway or classified as a high-risk for illness, please stay home and worship with us online.
- 3. Wearing face masks is mandatory for everyone (including children), when in the building. The only exceptions are the fully vaccinated worship speakers and limited choir singers. Masks must fully cover both the nose and mouth. Mask coverings will be provided if needed. If you are unable or choose not to wear a face mask, please stay home and worship with us online.
- 4. Maintain physical (social) distancing of at least six feet inside the building with people with whom you do not live with.
- 5. No physical embracing, shaking hands, hugging, or touching of other people outside of your household when in the building or parking lot. Our traditional "Meet and Greet" portion of the service has been temporally suspended.
- 6. Wash and/or sanitize your hands upon entering the building and as frequent as needed. Alcohol-based sanitizers are available in varied locations.
- 7. Practice good etiquette when coughing or sneezing. If you experience lengthy symptoms, please temporarily leave the building. Such actions demonstrate awareness of your and others' health concerns during this challenging pandemic time.
- 8. Respectfully sit in your assigned seating. Seating will occur in the order of arrival, front to back. If a family desires to be seated together, you must arrive and be seated at the same time.
- 9. Exit systematically as directed by the Pastor and Ushers (section and row will start from the rear of the church forward).
- 10. Our health and safety are everybody's responsibility. If someone is not adhering to guidelines, remind them in a caring tone. If uncomfortable in doing so or differences arise, please ask an Usher, Deacon, or another leadership person for assistance.
