v. 14 In the temple courts He found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money.

# 3. 3rd. Revelation: The Cleansing

v. 15 So He made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables.

#### 4. 4th Revelation: The Relationship and The Authority of Jesus

v. 16 To those who sold doves He said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!"

v. 17 His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me
